Brothers and sisters in Christ.

I think it's time I have "the talk"* with you, the good people of Peace and Trinity United Methodist Churches. Our denomination is in deep trouble. Divisions run deep. In fact, some of our top bishops indicate that we will probably soon be configured much differently than we are today. Decisions are now being made that will affect us all. Like many pastors, I have shielded the churches I serve from many of the goings on in our denominational life. I chose instead to accentuate the positives: "Our mission is to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world and we have an amazing structure dedicated to getting that done. We are providing disaster relief, eliminating malaria, equipping pastors, and growing exponentially in some of the poorest parts of the world." There is too much core work to do in Jesus' name to waste time being outraged over the extremism found on the fringes, I told myself.

So, over the years, I was silent. I didn't tell them about the UM bishop serving the conference just south of us that denied both Jesus' virgin birth and resurrection. I didn't tell them that certain UM pastors and laity set up a separate "Queer Communion" station on the floor of General Conference while delegates were celebrating the Lord's Supper. I didn't tell them about the millions of dollars from secular sources aimed at pressuring our church to change its stance on human sexuality. I didn't tell them that our Women's Division and General Board of Church and Society had membership, until recently, in the radical Religious Coalition for Reproductive Choice that espouses views contrary to our official UM stance on the sanctity of life and abortion. Talking about such things, I reasoned, would run counter to my goals of growing the local church and keeping it focused on our mission of making disciples of Jesus Christ. I was selectively mute... whistling my way past the graveyard of our denominational dysfunction. Surely as smart people of good will we can amicably figure something out without disrupting our local church ministries. Right? Apparently not.

Around General Conference 2016, the tactics from the radical fringe of our church switched from quiet non-compliance with our doctrine and discipline to open defiance. Our Western Jurisdiction unanimously elected Karen Oliveto, a pastor in a same-sex marriage, as a bishop in our church even though her lifestyle and doctrinal commitments should disqualify her from even being a candidate for UM ministry. As general superintendent of our church, her salary is supported by our apportionment dollars. I could justify meeting quiet disagreement with the same. But in times of upheaval and public rebellion to the good order of our church, silence equates consent.

Exactly because silence is no longer an option for me, I recently joined the Wesleyan Covenant Association, an organization that believes that the UMC is on target with its biblical doctrine and Christian ethics. Every church has a doctrinal and disciplinary framework. If this is not centered firmly on scripture and 2,000 years of Christian tradition, we are set adrift and are unable to throw a lifeline to our larger culture. The WCA is forming to support ministry in keeping with our stated UM values. In the coming months, I will be inviting our church councils to vote on making Trinity and Peace WCA member congregations.

The WCA Council is hearing from many pastors who have been silent and, like me, realize they no longer have this luxury. That is why I have shared with you these words today. It is also why I have accepted an invitation to be a member of the board of directors of the Wisconsin chapter of the WCA.

I know that these are hard words to hear, and that it may distress you that our beloved UMC has found itself in the situation it is in. Be of good courage, however, for Jesus Christ is still on the throne, at the right hand of God the Father, and He is still Lord of our lives. All we must do is trust and obey.



FEBRUARY 2017 COMMITTEE NOTES

CHURCH COUNCIL Russ and Pastor Wiley offered an opening devotion and prayer.

Minutes: Our Minutes of 23 January 2017 were unanimously approved.

Joys and Concerns: Prayers were requested for Ruth Moser and for the grieving families of Brian McBain, Ramona Adsit, and Leo Collins.

Old Business: We were reminded that the Candlelight Dinner is scheduled for this Saturday, 25 February. Paul mentioned that they may be a bit short on help, especially in the kitchen. The Church Windows software, to be used to create a new membership list, has arrived. Next week, Dean from Phoenix Computers will come to the office to upgrade our computer to handle the software and to provide an automatic back-up. This will occur while Pat is on vacation.

New Business: The Lenten services were reviewed. Please see the Worship Committee notes for the details. Peace has invited Trinity to share in producing a new pictorial directory. It will be produced by Life Touch International. There will be no cost to Trinity or Peace. Life Touch will take care of the sign-up details. New name tags are in process and should be completed very soon. We are asked to continue to wear these tags as they help visitors to remember names. Kathleen reported on a feasibility study session that she had attended at Willow Valley. The Conference is launching a capital campaign to raise money to "Make a New Wisconsin" by establishing new congregations and renewing 3existing congregations, helping to train leaders, and to help the poor. Pastor reported that special invitation cards had been ordered to invite people to attend our Easter "big day" celebration. When they arrive, they will be inserted into the bulletin and will be available in the Narthex. Paul told us that a second draft of an updated membership directory is finished. We will have an opportunity to review our entries from March 1st to the 26th, when the directory will be posted on a tripod in the Narthex. Please take time to do this important task! Rosie noted that the visitation team could use more help. She also noted these events-a camp promotion on March 5th and a potato bake on Sunday, March 19th, to begin about 11:30. Please plan to attend this event that helps the camp fund. The Council approved the purchase of twenty \$5.00 Kwik Trip gift cards, to be distributed to first time guests.

The Wesleyan Covenant Association: I decided that this important topic needed its own paragraph. Pastor Wiley distributed information about the WCA and described its origins and objectives. The WCA arose from a new development in a long standing controversy in the United Methodist Church. The controversy concerns whether the UMC should redefine "marriage" and whether it should ordain "practicing homosexuals."

The issues heated up in July 2016 when, during the General Conference (the meeting of delegates from all over the world), the Western Jurisdiction elected a practicing lesbian, who is married to a partner, as its bishop. This action, by unorthodox/progressive clergy and laypersons, was challenged by orthodox/conservative clergy and laypeople. The General Conference failed to take a vote on the issue and sent it for resolution to the Council of Bishops, which is our denomination's "supreme court." One article that I've read stated that, regardless of how the Council of Bishops decides the case, the dispute is going to continue.

In October 2016, many orthodox/conservative clergy and laypersons met in Chicago and formed the Wesleyan Covenant Association to try to hold the UMC in the United States to the terms of the *Discipline*. The *Discipline* defines marriage as between a man and woman and forbids the ordination of homosexuals.

So, how does this concern us in Wisconsin? In November 2016, the Wisconsin Conference Board of Ordained Ministry (BOM) issued a statement that I quote, in part, "We do not consider sexual orientation and gender identification to be sufficient reasons on their own, to deny God's call to ministry and they will not be considered in the evaluation of candidate by the Board of Ordained Ministry." In short, the BOM has decided to no longer ask questions that the *Discipline* requires to be asked of candidates for ordination.

This action by the BOM quickly drew a challenge from the Wisconsin Association of Confessing United Methodists. (WACUM) In its letter to Bishop Jung, WACUM pointed out many instances where the BOM's action violated the *Discipline*. It asked the Bishop to reverse the BOM's action. Bishop Jung decided to request that the BOM and WACUM "dialogue with each other, in the hope that they could reach an agreement. The fact is that the two sides to this issue have been talking **past** each other for years and I doubt these two groups will be able to reach a solution.

Over the next months, the Council will be considering whether to join the Wesleyan Covenant Association. The dues are \$1.50 per member and \$13.50 per month. Some of our members have already joined. You are urged to check out the WCA for yourself at wesleyancovenant.org. Their literature will describe the issues in greater detail then I have.
