# Happy Xmas!

(I can't believe the pastor just used Xmas instead of Christmas! And doesn't he know Christmas is over already?)

The 12 Days of Christmas start on Christmas Day and last until the evening of the 5th January - also known as Twelfth Night- the evening before Epiphany, which is the day the Magi visited the baby Jesus. The 12 Days have been celebrated in Europe since before the Middle Ages and were a time of celebration.


Christmas is also sometimes known as Xmas. Some people don't think it's correct to call Christmas 'Xmas' as that takes the 'Christ' (Jesus) out of Christmas. (Christmas comes from Christ-Mass, the Church service that celebrated the birth of Jesus.)

But that is not quite right! In the Greek language and alphabet, the letter that looks like an X is the Greek letter chi / X (pronounced 'kye' - it rhymes with 'eye') which is the first letter of the Greek word for Christ, Christos.

The early church used the first two letters of Christos in the Greek alphabet 'chi' and 'rho' to create a monogram (symbol) to represent the name of Jesus. This looks like an X with a small p on the top: ∤



The symbol of a fish is sometimes used by Christians (you might see a fish sticker on a car or someone wearing a little fish badge). This comes from the time when the first Christians had to meet in secret, as the Romans wanted to kill them (before Emperor Constantine became a Christian). Jesus had said that he wanted to make his followers 'Fishers of Men', so people started to use that symbol.



When two Christians met, one person drew half a basic fish shape (often using their foot in the dust on the ground) and the other person drew the other half of the fish. The Greek word for fish is 'Ikthus' or 'Ichthys'. There are five Greek letters in the word. It can also make up a sentence of Christian beliefs 'Ie-sous Christos Theou Huios So-te-r' which in English means "Jesus Christ, Son of God, and Savior". The second letter of these five letter is X or Christos! So, Xmas can also mean Christmas; but it should also be pronounced 'Christmas' rather than 'ex-mas'!

I hope everyone has had a wonderful Xmas with family and friends. If you have a friend or neighbor who does not attend a church, please invite them to join you in worship this new year. May the Lord bless you and keep you in 2018.

# January Memorial Ministry Corner



Check Off the List Another Major Project Completed! With either a "song of praise" or a "sigh of relief" (or both!), Memorial Ministry is very pleased to announce the completion of yet another of its major Trinity projects – Schmitt Hall Chairs. On Wednesday, December 20, 2017, a hardy troop of volunteers moved many boxes of chairs & new chair dollies from upstairs to downstairs. The cost for this project was \$4,605.80 and was funded as follows: Ruth Moser memorial, Ruth Moser estate bequest (Trustee funding), James & Lucille Johnston memorial, folding chair fund, & "wish list" fund. So, what have we received for this cost? Schmitt Hall will now be upgraded with 175 new folding chairs, six stacking padded chairs with arms, four new folding chair dollies, and one stacking chair dolly.

We wish to thank the following people, without whose efforts none of this could have been accomplished, for all their efforts from dreaming to planning to implementation: Larry & Susan Moser Hallett, Harvey & Kathy Bastian, honor gift contributors to the folding chair & "wish list" funds, Trinity Trustees, Trinity Memorial Ministry, Pastor G. Wiley Gladney, John Storer, Bill Twining, Dan Johnson, Fuzz & Nancy McCauley, Louise Murphey, Pat Leonard, Kathy Richardson, Howard Nelson, and members of the Richland Center High School (RCHS) National Honor Society (NHS) community service team coordinated by RCHS student Clay Bruckner. The NHS members were an invaluable force on December 20 of younger, stronger backs for the lifting and carrying of this equipment. We could not have done it without them!

Gradually, you will start to see this new equipment appear in Schmitt Hall. For a "sneak peek," check out the choir room! As for the old chairs and chair dollies, 50 of the better chairs will be held on reserve for use during the annual "Worship in the Park" event with the remainder of the chairs and old dollies being placed "up for sale" to Trinity & Peace members and then to the general public in a similar fashion as we did for our old banquet tables. Stay tuned for an official announcement of this sale after February 5, 2018.

#### December 2017 Committee Notes: By Jerry Bower, Lay Leader

**TRUSTEES:** Pastor Wiley opened our meeting with a prayer.

The Minutes of 2 October 2017 were unanimously approved.

Financial Reports: A review revealed that, due to the strong stock market, each of our investment accounts showed a gain over the previous month. The gains for the year are significant.

Parsonage Report: Things are calm. There were no items that needed attention.

Church Report: Several items, as noted below.

Ceiling Lights: Dick Marshall is having a difficult time finding a manufacturer that can supply all of the bulbs we need. This is a project still in progress.

Parking Lot: Sheldon's has not yet responded with a visit and an estimate. Obviously, this will now await Spring weather. The plan is to tear out the fractured sidewalk along the lot and replace it with blacktop, which should be easier to maintain. There was discussion of whether, when the lot is repaired and repainted, we should have a canopy installed at the east entrance. The conversation was lively. Shannon volunteered to make some contacts about design and expense. This will be on future agendas.

Water Issues: Doug Tyler dug out one of the west window wells and discovered that there is not a concrete floor in them. John suggested that the grates be covered with an appropriately colored corrugated sheet, to keep water from getting into the wells and, from there, migrating into the basement. John was given the go-ahead.

Grease Trap: John had the City Inspector look at our situation. The inspector said that, as long as we are not putting grease down our drains, we do not need a functioning grease trap. This is good news, as we were facing an extensive and expensive project to tear out and replace the trap. The current trap, however, does need to be removed and the piping needs to be replaced. John has one estimate of about \$1,000.00 and one day to complete. John will seek other estimates and we will decide who will do the work at a future meeting.

Back/East Door: As you know, there have been problems with this door not closing because it is scraping on the threshold. John and his son, Jeremiah removed the door and discovered that the adjusting screw is worn out. They placed a washer on the scr3ew, which holds the door up so that it can close. Sometime, we will investigate whether the adjusting screw can be replaced.

Outside Light: The light at the end of the sidewalk toward Seminary Street has been inoperative for a long time. Investigation revealed that the wire from the light into the building was broken. John arranged to have a wire buried from the light that is working to the broken one. Both lights are now working.

Wi-fi: Last Sunday, when the paragraph 213 task force met, the Wi-fi could not be accessed in the Library. The meeting was moved to the Narthex. A booster was purchased during Pastor Bill's tenure but has disappeared. Pastor Wiley volunteered to purchase a booster and install it so that the Wi-fi can be accessed in the east wing. Permission granted to make the purchase.

Other Business: Paul Murphey reported on several items.

Candlelight Dinner: As of now, there will NOT be a dinner in 2018, as the general chairperson has retired.

Paul is still trying to secure additional bids for installing an additional outlet in the Narthex kitchen and to install a speaker in the toddlers' room.

Pat Leonard has asked for permission to purchase ¾ new bulletin boards. Our present boards just aren't large enough to post all of the information that needs to be shared. After discussion, we approved the plan. Paul said that Memorial Ministry would finance the purchase from Wish List funds.

Finally, Paul told us that the new chairs have been ordered!!! He has arranged for NHS (National Honor Society) students to move the chairs from the parking lot, where the freighter will drop them, into the choir room in the basement. The order also includes four storage racks, six chairs with arms, and a storage rack for

the armed chairs. The total cost will be \$4,605.80. All but \$256.80 of this amount has been covered by gifts for the chairs and funds from several memorials. Some Wish List funds will also be used. Thanks, Paul, for bringing this project to a conclusion.

FINANCE COMMITTEE: Our meeting opened with a prayer.

Our review of the spreadsheets revealed that all of our obligations are up-to-date. At the end of November, our general fund had a balance of \$307.53. It appears that we will finish the year with all our bills paid. Many thanks to all of you who contribute to supporting Trinity's many ministries!

Introduction of new Contribution Envelopes: Pastor Wiley showed us a model of what the new envelopes will look like. Peace is already using this type of contribution envelope. The major change is that these envelopes will not be preprinted with our contribution number. So, we will need to take care to put our name on the envelope, so that the counters can credit our account. Putting your name on the envelope will be critical if you give cash, without a name, your account could not be credited! A major advantage of the new envelopes is that we will not have a lot of envelopes that we do not use and simply discard. For example, Donna & I contribute once a month, so we only use 12 envelopes from the package we received. The new system will be less expensive to operate.

Discussion of Committee Membership: Jerry noted that, due to resignations, Finance does not have an at-large member who attends regularly. Finance meets every other month, in the even numbered months on the first Wednesday, at 7:00. If you could help staff the Finance Committee (and learn a lot about how the church operates), please let Jerry know.

We approved the renewal of our Quick Books subscription, for \$610.00 plus tax. This is the system that we have used for years to keep our financial records

CHURCH COUNCIL: Because there was no urgent business, the December meeting of the Council was cancelled. The next meeting will occur on the third Monday of January 2018.




