

MISSIONS' "SILENT" HARVEST AUCTION



As you know, the annual Harvest Auction to support our covenant missionary, David Makobo, was canceled due to the pandemic. The Missions' Committee has decided to use this as an opportunity to try a different approach to fundraising, a **Silent Harvest Auction**.

By <u>Sunday</u>, <u>October 18th</u>, there will be a number of **themed baskets** on display in the narthex. Also, there will be some Harvest Auction certificates that can be redeemed for a service or product, such as Rosie's Famous Lasagna, yard work, frozen food items, etc. Due to limited display space in the narthex, the committee had to limit items for bid to baskets and certificates.

SILENT AUCTION DIRECTIONS: If you'd like to participate in the auction, you'll need a number. After the worship service on any Sunday between October 18th and November 15th, someone will be available to help you sign up for a number. You can also call Kathy Bastian, 647-4948; she can assign you a number.

By the auction items, there will be a blank sheet of paper. On the sheet of paper, write your auction NUMBER (NOT your name) followed by the amount of your bid. Please don't increase the bid in amounts of less

than \$1.00. So, if #1 bid \$3.00, the next bid should be at least \$4.00. The cut-off date for bidding will be Sunday, November 15th, so remember to check your bids each Sunday. Part of the fun of a silent auction is the same as an in-person auction—trying to outbid the previous bid! Friendly rivalry is encouraged.

Winning bidders will be announced no later than Sunday, November 22nd. You may pay for your items following the service and take them with you, or someone will call you and arrangements can be made for delivery. Payment will be due at the time of delivery. If you have a Harvest Auction certificate, you will contact the donor and make arrangements for delivery. Checks should be made out to Trinity United Methodist Church with Harvest Auction on the memo line.

If you aren't able to participate in the silent auction, please consider a donation to help us reach our covenant amount of \$1,000 in support of David Makobo and his ministry in Senegal, Africa. The last Sunday offering for missions this month will also support David Makobo. Thank you for keeping David and his wife in your prayers.

Missions' November Focus



Snack Pack for Backpacks is a Richland School District program that began in 2018. A team of dedicated individuals wanted to make sure that Richland School District students in need had something to eat outside of the school day, especially on weekends and holidays when school wasn't in session.

Students in grades K-8 are **confidentially** nominated by their teachers; those accepted into the program receive a bag of nutritious, nonperishable food that slips easily into their backpack.

Previously, volunteers from Trinity joined other volunteers at the Richland Middle School to assemble the snack packs. This year, due to the pandemic, the program will be handled somewhat differently, but according to Gretchen Kanable, RMS Guidance Counselor, the district is going forward with Snack Pack for Backpacks. There are a number of children in the district who need this food resource. Your very welcome donation will help to make this program possible by providing funds for the purchase of food for the backpacks.
