How To Be Prepared And Ready For The Second Coming Of Jesus Christ

Many false messiahs will come in the name of Jesus, pretending to be Christ. The instruction is to not go after them. People will be searching for the truth and at the same time, many false teachers and prophets will come in the last days. Many of them will be teaching apostasy and heresy like never before in the history of the world.

Sinful men will be present in the world and in the Christian church and they will be introducing doctrines of demons. We see that happening in the world today. In addition, great commotions will take place around the world: earthquakes, famines, evil and violence everywhere, people searching for peace living in their country of origin, great deceptions affecting the mission and the ministry of the church, people living in the Christian church, and churches closing down because of the lack of faith and attendance. An increase in idolatry will prepare the hearts of people to worship the beast, listen to the false prophets, and the anti-Christ.

Rebellion against God will take place, with people blaspheming the most holy and secret name of God Almighty. People will be more lovers of evil than lovers of God. They will hold onto the sinful desires of their flesh, rather than trusting God's word. They will be looking to satisfy the desires of their flesh, rather than living by the Spirit of the Living God and inclining their actions toward becoming more a worldwide hedonist society. They will be haters of the truth.

A major cultural shift it is taking place in the today's world like never before. Instead of forgiving one another, and accepting each other as Christ received us, we are becoming antagonists against each other. What we observe in society is major division over many issues, even with those who claim faith in the Lord. As the second coming of Jesus is getting closer people are becoming more intolerant with anyone with whom they may have disagreements. The question Peter asked the Lord Jesus in Matthew is relevant: "Lord, if another member of the church sins against me, how often should I forgive? As many as seven times?" Jesus said to him, "Not seven times, but I tell you, seventy-seven times." (Matthew 18:21-22) Jesus puts no statute of limitations on the forgiveness of sins for you to your brother.

Therefore, the healthy and spiritual way to be prepared, ready, and waiting for the second coming of the Lord is by having fellowship with God and with one another. 1 John 1:6 says, "If we say that we have fellowship with him while we are walking in darkness, we lie and do not do what is true; but if we walk in the light as he himself is in the light, we have fellowship with one another and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin." And 1 John 3:15 says, "All who hate a brother or sister are murderers, and you know that murderers do not have eternal life abiding in them." Hebrews says, "Pursue peace with everyone, and the holiness without which no one will see the Lord. See to it that no one fails to obtain the grace of God; that no root of bitterness springs up and causes trouble, and through it many become defiled." (Hebrews 12: 14-15)

Reading and studying the Holy Scriptures, praying, fasting, having fellowship with one another, being involved in the ministry of the Church, gathering weekly for Bible study and worship, sharing the word of the Lord with others, and keeping ourselves holy will help us to be ready for the second coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.


A REMINDER REGARDING KWIK TRIP CARDS

The Missions Committee would like to thank you for supporting Trinity's mission projects by purchasing and using or giving Kwik Trip scrip cards. Here is an important reminder about using the cards:

If the card has been inactive for a year or more, Kwik Trip will start deducting a certain amount each month until there is a \$0.00 balance. We have received reports of some people who used Kwik Trip scrip cards being surprised when they discovered their balance was less than it was supposed to be. This is most likely because, during the time Trinity didn't have services due to the pandemic, very few cards were sold or used. The older Kwik Trip cards were then sold when church services resumed. Some of those may have been a year or more old, and the clock on the balance started ticking, so to speak, when TRINITY purchased the cards, NOT when the cards were purchased by church attendees.

There is a simple way to fix this. You can call Kwik Trip and ask that your card be "refreshed." Before you use a Kwik Trip scrip card, call the 800 number on the back of the card. If your card is an "older" card and an amount has already been subtracted from that card <u>due to inactivity</u>, Kwik Trip will add that amount back onto your card. For technical reasons having to do with lost or stolen cards, they have a policy of subtracting a monthly fee from long-time inactive cards. HOWEVER, Kwik Trip does not want unhappy customers, so if you call Kwik Trip and state that you want your card refreshed, they will happily load the "inactive card" amount back onto your card.

If you give or have given Kwik Trip cards as gifts: please tell the recipient to call the 800 number on the back of the card to check the balance. If any amount was subtracted before they used the card, they should then request that the card be "refreshed." Please inform the Missions Committee if you have any issues with the scrip cards that you can't resolve. Thank you, and we apologize to anyone who may have encountered problems using scrip cards.


