However, you can still count me as your friend. As I am writing this letter to you, I feel sad leaving Richland Center and leaving behind many friends that I have made in these two congregations and this community. I have been here for the last 4 years and pretty soon after I was appointed to serve here the Covid-19 Pandemic arrived to paralyze churches, businesses, and factories. The members of these two congregations will always be in my heart. I love you all and I hope to keep your friendship as we keep serving the Good Lord. As we move ahead into another chapter in our lives, I will keep you in my prayers that the Good Lord will be with the members of Trinity and Peace UMC during the days ahead. I am hoping and praying that the Good Lord keeps you in his sight and that these two congregations experience church growth and many other blessings.

As you are all aware, you will have a new pastor appointed to these two congregations. I also need you to remember that although we certainly can remain friends, I cannot return to these congregations to perform weddings, funerals, baptisms, or any other duties that your new pastor will be then in charge of.
