

Pentecost May 19th to November 17th

Fifty years after Jesus' resurrection, on a day called Pente-cost, the Christian Church was born. Because Pentecost was a holiday celebrating the harvest (a bit like our Thanksgiving), the apostles and a large crowd had gathered to celebrate I Jerusalem.

² "Suddenly a sound like the blowing f a violet wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. ³They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. ⁴All of theme were filled with the Holy Spirit an began to speak in other tongues as the sprit enabled them." (Acts 2:2-4 NIV)

As the wind and fire descended as sorts of languages, known and unknown, came out of the crowd. Each person spoke "about God's deeds of power" (verse 11). "No wonder Luke wrote, All were amazed and perplexed saying to oner another, 'What does this mean?"

The whole affair was mind-boggling and lifechanging. The Holy Spirit had come upon many people; they knew God was powerfully at work in their midst.

On Pentecost many years ago, some 3,000 people came to believe in Christ. That's why today Christians remember the powerful event as the birthday of the church.
